### Written in the *stars*.

The word 'sunny' was meant to describe Haydn's First Cello Concerto - 20 minutes of pure joy, from its chirruping opening movement through to the spirited exchanges between soloist and orchestra in the finale. The starry beauty of a wintry night sky inspired the shimmering soundscape by Finnish composer Kaija Saariaho. Sibelius' symphony – rugged and magnificent - has an elemental power and immense intensity. Legend has it that Don Juan was the world's greatest lover, and in Strauss's musical portrait you'll find out why; the opening string flurry, capped by blazing trumpets, puts you at once in a world of amorous pursuit.



### Musical worlds meeting in harmony.

Step into the wide open spaces of the American prairies. Hushed strings form a soft blanket of sound, and the tender song of the cor anglais emerges – Dvořák's symphony embraces the spirit of the New World with a big heart. There's more emotional generosity in the swirling orchestral showpiece by another Eastern European master, Kodály. His Dances of Galánta are a slow burn – beginning with delicate woodwind solos culminating in fastpaced excitement for the whole orchestra. 



The violin leaps acrobatically at one moment and swoons in ecstasy at another - Korngold's vibrantly optimistic concerto is a rollicking adventure and passionate love scene all in one. Rachmaninov's Symphonic Dances offer kaleidoscopic instrumental colours, from a lyrical saxophone solo to ghostly woodwinds evoking a haunted ballroom. Before it, a solo iridescent flute sets Debussy's impressionist musical picture in motion. In an anthem for the 21st century, the strings play snappy, splintering, ricocheting figures in Jessie Montgomery's riff on The Star-Spangled Banner.



Sung and narrated in the Yugambeh language, this new work by Grayson Rotumah reflects Bundjalung history and culture through the re-imagining of creation stories, spiritual, mission and massacre songs. Through dance, song and atmospheric orchestral interludes, intermingled with the sound of the yidaki, the work explores Rotumah's lived experience at Booningbah and his life as a contemporary indigenous artist. ### Storm and sunlight

Emily Sun's previous performances with the ASO left the audience wanting more. Now, the remarkable young violinist joins another superb Australian musician, pianist Andrea Lam, for a special recital. Grieg's Sonata opens in darkness but its melodies soon shine with warmth and radiance. The six pieces in Sibelius' suite range from a virtuosic Gypsy dance to a gentle lullaby. Aaron Copland's Clarinet Concerto begins with spacious, bittersweet melodies before the jazz-inflected world of the second half takes hold. The clarinet leads the way with the first big tune in Schubert's Third Symphony too. Spirited, buoyant and energetic this is a work that overflows with charm. ### Magnificence

This is a study in timeless grandeur. 




